Marcus Rosten: Environmental Educator



As a Cheektowaga native my love for nature was instilled at an early age thanks to weekly nature walks with my grandmother at Stiglmeier Park and summers spent camping at Allegany State Park with my family. This inspired me to pursue a career outdoors and earn a degree in Environmental Education and Interpretation at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry. Since then, I've served as an interpretive park ranger in our national parks and forests, led stewardship projects with local non-profit organizations, and worked as a wildlife technician conducting wildlife surveys, managing habitats, and monitoring invasive species for state and federal agencies. I am excited to be an Environmental Educator back home at Reinstein Woods, where I served as an intern in 2016!

When I'm not in the Woods, I can be found birding, skiing, kayaking along the Niagara River, or singing with the Buffalo Philharmonic Chorus. I hope to see you at Reinstein Woods!

Member Highlight: Mary Jo Stock

After receiving her Bachelor's degree from Buffalo State College, Mary Jo was a school teacher in NYC for 15 years. Mary Jo grew up in Depew just minutes away from Reinstein Woods with her parents, four brothers and sister. While her mother, Margaret, was from Brooklyn, her father, Larry, was a Depew native. Her mother became affiliated with the Historical Society of Depew and became friends with Dr. Reinstein and Julia Reinstein through Julia's participation in the Historical Society of Cheektowaga.

Now 77 years old, Mary Jo recalls meeting the Reinsteins in 1955, when she was ten years old. She remembers when the beavers were introduced to the land and made frequent visits to the woods.



Mary Jo often walks the woods and refers to it as her spiritual place. She has a special tree she likes to pray at. Her love of nature developed throughout her childhood. She fondly recalls having cookies and ginger ale with her grandma, who owned a quarry. On the quarry there was a body of water filled with carp & ducks. She credits that time with her grandparents at the quarry and growing up by Reinstein Woods as part of the reason she learned how nature balanced each other, and the reason she got to love nature. Thank you for letting us be a part of your story, Mary Jo!

Reinstein Woods receives Watershed Ed Grant

Reinstein Woods will engage teachers and students in a new "Niagara River/Lake Erie (NRLE) Classrooms" program thanks to a \$76,006 grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Great Lakes region Bay Watershed Education and Training (B-WET) program. We will connect at least 10 teachers and 100 students in grades 4-12 to the Niagara River/Lake Erie (NRLE) watershed. School districts with high levels of economically disadvantaged students were targeted for participation, and ten teachers attended their first workshops and field trips in May.

Led by DEC, <u>Buffalo Niagara Waterkeeper</u>, and SUNY Fredonia's Institute for Research in Science Teaching, the program will increase the educators' understanding of environmental issues within the watershed. These teachers will form a network of NRLE Classrooms to encourage peer-to-peer conversations between teachers and students.

Students in NRLE Classrooms will enjoy both indoor and outdoor watershed learning during the 2022-2023 school year, including the "Day in the Life of the NRLE Watershed" hosted by Reinstein Woods.
