REMEMBERING A TRUE FRIEND

Friends of Reinstein Woods lost a dedicated volunteer with the passing of Michael Gettings on October 15. Mike lived a life of service and joy. He became a nature guide at Reinstein Woods in 2009, after retiring from a career working with people with disabilities. He joined the Friends' board of directors in 2010, and over the next nine years served as Vice-President, President, and Membership Committee Chair. He convinced his wife Carol, who taught non-profit leadership at Buffalo State, to lead the board in developing the organization's first strategic plan.

Mike then led the board in implementing that plan, which included developing the website we use today. As Membership Committee Chair, Mike wanted to help members explore the outdoors beyond Reinstein Woods, organizing field trips to places as far away as Canandaigua.

Mike was a "people person," and he loved guiding people through Reinstein Woods, particularly groups of people with disabilities. His granddaughter, Hope, was his "assistant" on many tours. Mike connected Reinstein Woods to groups like the Center for Self Advocacy, leading to improvements such as automatic door handles that make Reinstein Woods more accessible.

Mike was always spreading joy, whether collecting donations at the Fall Festival or passing out snowshoes and skis to visitors in the winter. Beyond the day-to-day needs of Reinstein Woods, Mike could be counted on for help wherever needed, whether lending a shoulder to a staff member having a bad day or connecting a fellow volunteer to hospice services. His energy and enthusiasm will be sorely missed.




MEMBERSHIP MEMOS

CLIMATE CONNECTIONS FOR BUFFALO'S EAST SIDE YOUTH

Friends of Reinstein Woods has partnered with New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Erie County Department of Environment and Planning, and the Omega Mentoring Program to connect students from the East Side with community leaders working on climate action.

During the 2023-2024 school year, about 30 high school students will meet biweekly to go on field trips and work on environmental projects. The field trips introduce students to habitats and environmental issues in WNY while exploring business, nonprofit and government careers related to the environment. The environmental projects were chosen by the students. Some projects include supporting community gardens and hosting a Dare to Repair Café at Johnny B. Wiley Center.

The first field trip was to Niagara Falls and the NY Power Authority Vista, where students learned about the Niagara River's Important Bird Area and the generation of clean electricity at the Niagara Power Project.

On the second field trip, students visited the Buffalo Freedom Gardens and met with gardens founder Gail Wells. The gardens were founded to provide BIPOC community members effected by the pandemic access to healthy food.

Future field trips will include: Solar Powered Solar Carousel, Just Buffalo Literary Center, Bailey Green, Viridi Parente, Buffalo State University Great Lakes Center, Colonel Ward Pumping Station, Tifft Nature Preserve, Steels Winds.

DAY IN THE LIFE RECAP

2023 was another great year for the Day In The Life of the Niagara Rover/Lake Erie Watershed program! About 440 students and teachers from 14 schools collected physical, chemical and biological data from creeks throughout the watershed as part of this annual event sponsored by Friends of Reinstein Woods.

THE ECLIPSE IS COMING!

On April 8, 2024, Western New York will experience a Total Solar Eclipse! That means we will experience about three and a half minutes of darkness in the middle of the afternoon. You will also be able to see the moon move in front of the sun if you have the right gear!

We have solar eclipse glasses that will allow you to do just that. These glasses are safe for personal use, and use with a smart phone (if you're going to try and catch a picture of the eclipse on your phone). If you want to use binoculars, telescopes, or cameras to view and capture the eclipse, you will need different safety gear.

Stop by the education center to buy your solar eclipse glasses from us. They are \$2 for a single pair, or \$5 for 3 pairs. Make sure you are ready for this amazing event. The next time this will happen in New York will be May 1, 2079!



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
